NOTICE REGARDING MASSACHUSETTS LAW MGL C. 147 SECTION 25 Under Massachusetts law, MGL c.147 section 25, a license to engage in the business of private detective shall not be granted to any person who has been convicted of a felony in any state of the United States. Similar laws apply in many other states. Massachusetts law further provides, under MGL c. 147 section 23, that no person shall engage in, advertise or hold himself out as being engaged in, nor solicit private detective business, unless licensed for such purpose as provided in section 25.
